

Catalogue – Small Private Collections (1), Carlow County Archives Service

Introduction

This catalogue describes a variety of archival documents acquired from private sources by Carlow County Archives Service. Most items are standalone and are not related to other items described here. Documents were normally donated by their owners or purchased either at auction or from booksellers.

The spellings of placenames sometimes change over time. The placename spelling in the original document is given, and where a modern equivalent is known, it follows in round brackets.

The use of square brackets indicates uncertainty about the veracity of the information contained within them.

Their signatures are on verso however, the second name occupier gives his name as Felix Tallon. Extent of mapped land is 48 acres, 3 roods and 35 perches plantation measure. Map drawn in ink and watercolours and shows the road to Carlow town. Surveyed by Laurence Nowlan at cost of £0.12.3.

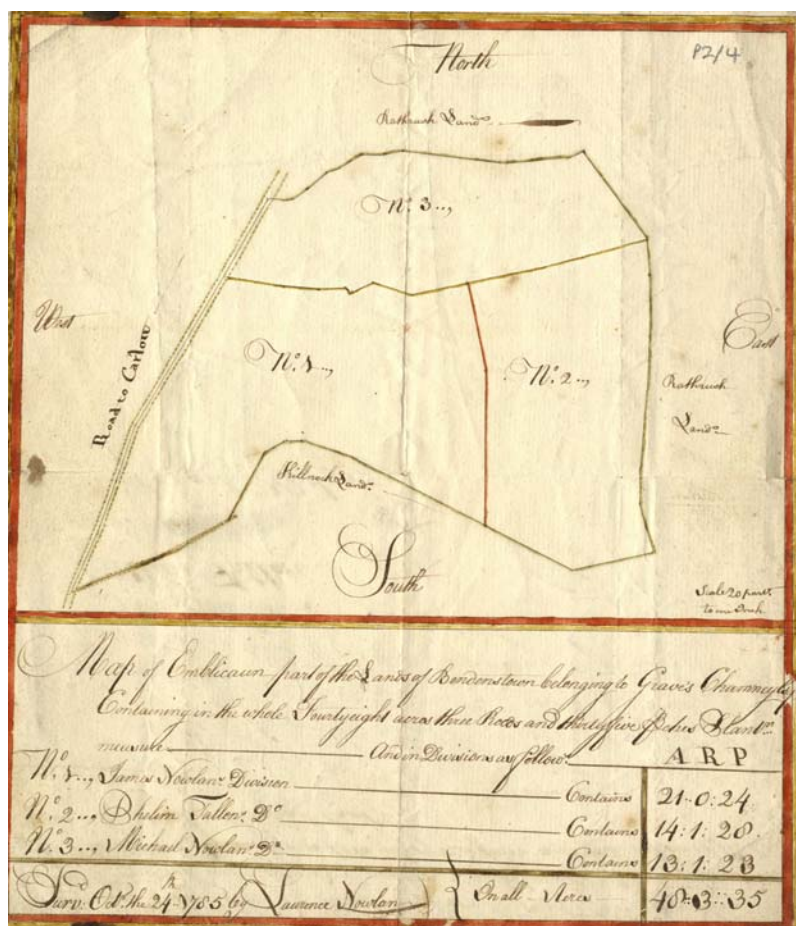

of Cloghanagh (Cloghna), Ballybannon and part of the lands of Clochristigg. Turnpike road to begin on the bounds between Cloghagh and Mortlestown (Mortarstown) and ending at a lough on the lands of Clochristigg, and measuring 148.8 feet. Survey completed by James Wadcin, certified land surveyor. Map also shows old turnpike road from Carlow town to Leighlinbridge.

Description Letter from the tenants of Upper Seskin and Lower Seskin, Leighlinbridge, county Carlow, to Walter McMurrugh Kavanagh, Member of Parliament. Requests Kavanagh to ask in the House of Commons if the lands on which they are living have been sold through the Irish Land Commission, and if so, to identify the beneficiary. Writer states that it has been 35-40 years since there was an owner, Lady Grey. Writer then proceeds to list names of trustees and others to whom interest in the estate devolved afterwards; tenants' refusal to pay rent; and subsequent legal action.
